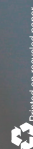
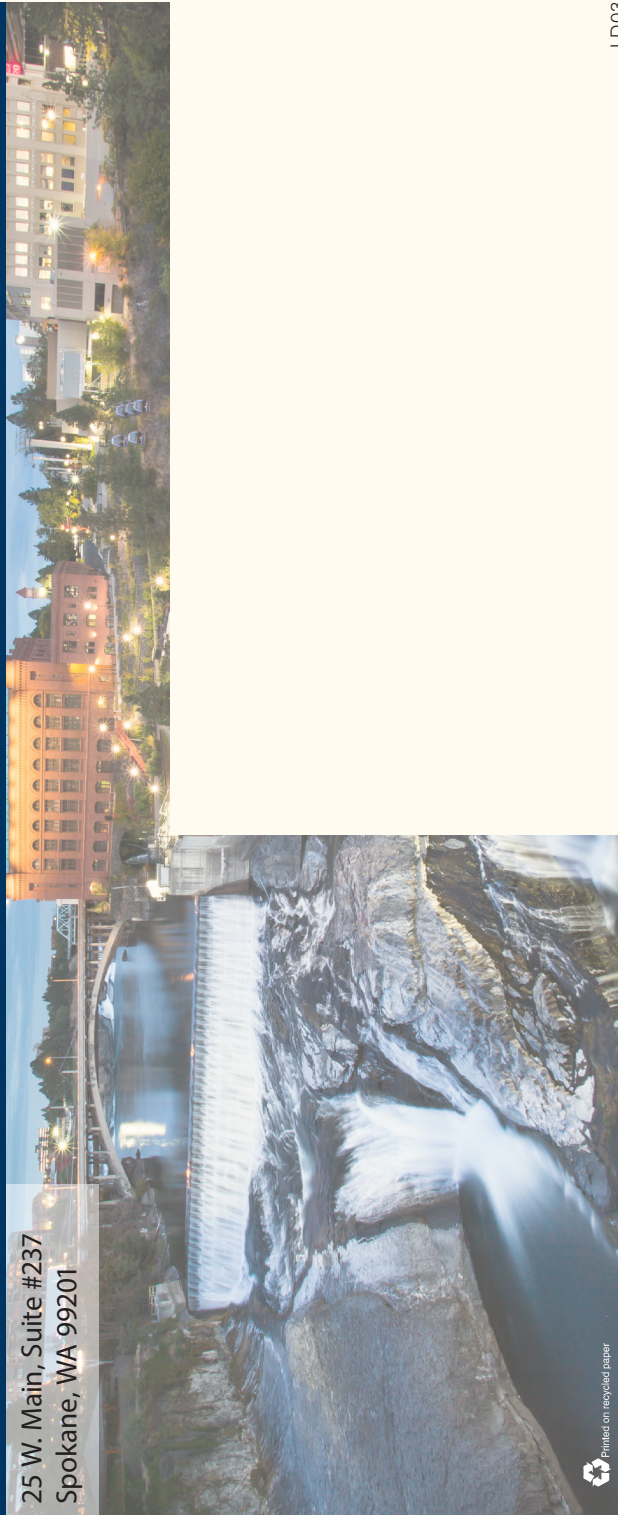

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 2021 WASHINGTON STATE LEGISLATURE

## SUPPORTING A STRONG ECONOMY

Supported more than **12,000 small businesses with assistance grants.**

Funded the **Working Families Tax Credit** to put money back in the pockets of families who need it.

Reduced unemployment tax liability **by \$1.7 billion** for small businesses most impacted by the pandemic.

Provided **\$1.6 billion in rental assistance for tenants and landlords** to keep people safe and housed.

Historic state-wide investments in **broadband** expansion & reliability.



## CREATING HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES

Passed landmark childcare legislation – The Fair Start Act – to make **high-quality childcare more affordable & accessible** for families in Spokane and across the state.

Historic **investments in public health infrastructure** to bolster our state's ability to defeat COVID-19 and be better prepared for the next emergency.

Funding to complete the WSU's **Eelson S. Floyd College of Medicine** school expansion.

Worked to reduce the **costs of prescription medications** for Washington consumers.

Improved **public health boards** by requiring more balanced representation.

Expanded **food assistance programs** so children don't go hungry.

## ADVANCING EQUITY & RACIAL JUSTICE

Passed a dozen **police accountability policies** designed to build community trust, increase state oversight, and raise standards for police conduct.

Adopted the **HEAL ACT** to address the disproportionate exposure to environmental hazards suffered by communities of color and low-income communities that lead to a higher risk of adverse health outcomes.

Established **Juneteenth** as a legal holiday.

Passed historic funding for Washington's **Immigrant Relief Fund.**

Increased **support for counselors** at high-poverty schools.



## CLEANER AIR AND WATER

Joined our West Coast neighbors by adopting a **clean fuel standard** to reduce carbon emissions and pollution.

Increased support for **Spokane River Toxics Taskforce**, a collective effort to protect our river, and secured \$5.1 million for the Cochran Basin Stormwater Project.

A tripling of the investment in the **“No Child Left Inside” program** to fund grants connecting underserved youth to nature.

Increased funding for **forest health** and **wildfire suppression and prevention.**
